We believe that children, young people and protected adults have the right to be safe, secure and free from threat

We believe that children, young people and protected adults have the right to be treated with respect, and to have their concerns listened to and acted upon

We will ensure that the club provides for the needs of vulnerable groups through specific programmes, designated facilities and safe practice

We have procedures in place to address poor practice, and to help any young / protected person who appears to be at risk, or who appears to be the victim of abuse. We will offer help and support when a child, young person or protected adult tells us that they are affected by these issues

By using references and background checks, we will ensure that club volunteers and professionals working with children and protected adults are suitable to do so. Club members, coaches and volunteers who have regular contact with children and protected adults, through paid and unpaid work, will require to possess a current PVG Scheme record / certificate, obtained through the LTA'S PVG Scheme process. Such record shall be displayed on the Club's noticeboard.

We will ensure that all of those working with children and protected adults are required to adhere to the LTA Code of Conduct for people working with children and protected adults in tennis. Lenzie Tennis Club has an adult member who is specifically responsible for children, young people and protecting vulnerable groups (Welfare Rights Officer)
